



2. Make a Decision



In making a decision to learn to pray & stand before the Lord We grow in relationship with Him

3. Your Prayer Corner



Once you have decided to make time to pray you will have to prepare a prayer corner

For this habit of prayer to become long lasting, nothing works better than paying attention to the place where we pray.

4. Preparation




Not only are your surroundings important to pray well, to try to enter into prayer but so is the way you enter into prayer, the way you prepare yourself to pray.

5. Relationship



Do I truly understand who I am speaking to? Not so that I become afraid or intimidated but simply to realize the truth and to enter into a relationship with God, my Creator.

6. Friendship




Mental prayer is an intimate business of friendship where we speak often one on one with God who we know loves us.

7. Set a time; Hold to It




I am going to give God a gift of time; a time for him; a time to pray; a time to be at his side.

8. Desire for God


11. The Virgin Mary & Prayer

13. Distractions, Preoccupations




It is important to distinguish between Distractions& Preoccupations

14. Dryness or Nights




When in dryness

15. Meditation



Meditation is how prayer is nourished.
To avoid a wandering mind and distractions, we use a Scripture Passage or a Spiritual Reading to enter into relationship with God.

16. Contemplation



There comes a time in meditation when nothing happens. It is often the time to let go and allow God to guide us; let God lead and introduce us into contemplation.

17. Prayer & John of the Cross



Saint John of the Cross invites us to practice detachment.
He encourages us to go through the 'night' to truly meet God.

18. Adoration vs. Silent Prayer




Even if adoration & silent prayer are two different ways of approaching prayer, they are two ways of praying, having the same goal: **Union with God**

19. God speaks, Listen



If I pray, it is to listen to God. He is there. He is waiting for me. It is about making myself available to God with my whole being. Prayer is not about doing but about being.

20. I speak; what do I say?




If a listening attitude is of utmost importance in prayer, it is to allow us to then express ourselves, to speak to Our Lord, to tell him what is in our hearts, to profess our love for him.

21. Silence




We will come to see silence as a place to meet God, a place where Elijah experienced God on Mount Horeb

22. The Our Father




Do you remember in the Gospel when the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray? He responds with the Our Father

23. Role of God's Word




God speaks to us personally through his Word.

25. Prayer: A Free Gift




