Snippet #7: Set a Time & Hold to It

There is a subject, which needs to be discussed. It certainly is not an easy one. It concerns setting a time to pray.

When we pray we need to set aside a reasonable amount of time. We are going to be in prayer, remain in prayer and give thanks at the end of the time of prayer. It is up to you to decide on an amount of time that will to be beneficial to you —ten minutes, fifteen minutes or more for those who are used to it. Once this time is set, we have to hold to it.

This time is a gift I offer to God. He created me. He gave me life. He gave me his Son, the Christ. He has given me the biggest gift. Therefore, humbly and simply, I offer him the gift of time even if I am bored, the time seems long or I have a ton of things to do. We are all in the same situation.

Therefore, I give God this time. Consider this time like a visit to someone. Maybe nothing happened or I have the impression that nothing happened, but this time belongs to God. It is the most beautiful thing I can do for God. He will be there by my side. He will listen to me. He is there.
